On October 16th I had the pleasure of attending the Mankota-Canadian Angus Rancher Endorsed Calf Sale. My friend and fellow Angus producer Cassie and I started the day by driving down to Sandy Bar Angus or the Switzer residence after spending the night in Swift Current. Bob and Gail's ranch is about 30 minutes north of Mankota. If you have no idea where Mankota is, don't worry: I didn't either before asking Google. Mankota is located in the deep south, wide open grasslands of Saskatchewan. It is not far from the U.S. border. You can literally see for miles with many black and red cows roaming the pastures. Bob took us on a tour of his place



and we looked at the heifer and bull calves and saw a few cows that were around the home place. Then we followed Bob across the slightly dusty gravel roads to the little town of Mankota. There are approximately

300 people that live in or around Mankota so it reminded me a bit of Lougheed, the small community where I grew up. We walked over to the auction market and I was amazed by the number of calves that were there: 4,913 calves, all tagged Angus and mainly all black. That was something to see for sure. My friend Cassie and I walked around checking out what the producers had brought to town. Every pen was full with superior Angus genetics. After taking a look around we had to have a burger. I was told by a few wise men that we had to have a burger and pie while in

at the World Angus Secretariat meeting in Mexico. Four years ago, when David Bolduc, Kirk Wildman and I were the CAA's voting delegates at the Secretariat meeting in Argentina, we voted for Mexico to host the 2015 Secretariat and am I ever grateful that we did. In that time frame, Mexico's Angus producers have embraced Canadian genetics and, as we toured Mexico's ranch country in Chihuahua, experienced the World Show in Durango and met to discuss global Angus issues in Mazatlan, we came to realize the impact Canadian genetics are having in Mexico. Canada had the largest delegation at the World Angus Secretariat with more than 45 people attending, and we were all proud to see how our "great white north" genetic pool is prospering in and developing Mexico's Angus Herd Book.

As a result, pretty much my entire message this month will be drawing attention to those Canadian Angus producers whose genetics have literally helped to grow a nation's Angus seedstock production. I know that shows are only one of the tools of our Association outputs and that you can't gauge an entire nation's cowherd by what you see at a show. But I also believe that shows are a 'snapshot' of what genetics are not only popular, but really working, at any point in time. So I feel quite confident to cite that our fellow Canadians' breeding programs are working very, very well for our Mexican friends!

And to illustrate this to you, please consider this...

Mankota. Let me tell you neither of those dishes disappointed me! I could have very easily taken a pie home with me.

The sale started and it was extremely strong throughout the afternoon. They ran the 4,900 calves through the ring in less than four hours which was very impressive. I was even more impressed with the quality of calves that were running through the ring. Pen after pen were sound Angus calves. If only I had the truck and trailer there to load up some heifer calves to take home with me. After the sale was finished, we visited with some of the producers. I asked them why they chose to sell at this particular sale. The common answer was they see a better price (on average a nickel or dime more) and the outstanding quality of the calves. They were proud to

sell their animals at a sale like this. Some of the producers had come from hours away just to sell at this sale. I am very happy that I was able to experience it!

The Mankota sale is a leading example of what the Angus tags can do for your program!

Black and Red Angus shows. This summary of the results identifies the Canadian Angus Association members involved. Please note that I am factoring in parental and grand-parental pedigree information, so, essentially three generations to determine Canadian genetics. The WAS shows featured approximately 160 Black Angus and 100 Red Angus. In Mexico, the Red and Black genetics feature regularly in BOTH colour shows.

Miller Wilson Angus factored prominently, including the following: DMM Ambush 03M featured in 2 pedigrees, including a class winner and Black Angus Senior Champion Female. DMM Flexor 12L and DMM Riptide 28Y each featured in multiple pedigrees. The following DMM animals featured in 1 pedigree: DMM Roar 6A, DMM Essence 17T, DMM Flora 32Z, DMM Dynasty 37L, DMM Crunch 31T and DMM Creed 93Y. DMM Creed 46X and DMM Bubba 2Y each featured in the pedigree of a class winner. DMM Iron Spirit 40X, son of Red U-2 Big League 544R (from the Unger Family of U-2 Ranch) featured in 4 pedigrees, including 3 class winners, one of which became the Black Angus Reserve Senior Bull Calf Champion and another of which became the Black Angus Junior Champion Female and the Grand Champion Female.

Hamilton Farms also proved dominant, including the following: HF Tiger 5T, featured in 5 pedigrees, including 3 class winners, two of which, out of Tiger daughter HF Pride 32X (herself featured in 3 pedigrees including 2 class winners), were named Black Angus Reserve Senior Champion Bull and the Black Angus Junior Champion Bull who became Grand

### From the Registry Desk

Please note that there is a NEW option when submitting an online batch. If you have two possible sires on a calf that you are trying to register, enter both and you will get a DNA requisition for the two bulls that you have entered. This will help to eliminate the number of Requests for Information (RFIs) that you may receive.

### Do you read the fine print??

If you are like most people, you might scan the fine print, but do you really read it? So many of our members don't read the information that we send them and end

up paying higher fees as a result. RFIs or Request for Information sheets have questions or statements that your CAA staff cannot answer on your behalf or cannot override. For example:

*Error - Sire SGP WAY TO GO 44Z is not sire verified*

*Error - Original Owner SGP Cattle does not have access to dam WHELAN'S HAPPY GO LUCKY 16A at birth 06/04/2015. A lease or transfer of this dam is required.*

**Until you correct the issues and inform us, your calves will remain unregistered.** The other very important thing that members overlook are the following statements on the bottom of every RFI:

Any changes or corrections are to be made in writing, and either faxed or mailed back to the Canadian Angus Office. Please make the necessary changes or corrections directly on this form. To ensure accuracy, we can not accept changes or corrections over the telephone.

The fee for this registration will be held for 90 days. After that time period, the fee will increase as per its age upon completion, as per the current fee schedule.

If you are a Performance Herd, please be aware pending animals are excluded from National Cattle Evaluations. When the data for the Spring and the Fall evaluation is extracted, the pedigree and performance records for pending animals are not included. Please respond to this Request for Information as soon as possible.

Please note that the first line states that we need to have the corrections in writing. It is imperative that we have a written record of why changes were made. Please note that we accept e-mailed responses to RFIs.

The second highlighted line reads 90 DAYS. The 90 days is calculated from the date of your work order, so it is imperative that you read your e-mails or mail from us and respond as quickly as possible to avoid paying higher registration fees.

Please contact the office if you need any assistance.

Get your pedigree extracts requested in time!

Your Association provides you with an extremely valuable service: electronic pedigree extracts that include complete pedigree and performance information on your sale calves to make it easier to create catalogues. To request the service, email your Association a list of tattoos or registration numbers in sale order. Pedigree extracts are available for \$2.50/animal and are processed within two working days. There is no rush service for these; they are processed as soon as possible. Please leave yourselves enough time and get your requests submitted early.

Members can also request the Sales Promotion Package (\$45) which includes posting your catalogue online, promoting your sale on social media, and the use of program logos and ads.
