## Message from the Member Service Team

### TIP 1

A few common Request for Information (RFIs) include the following:

1. **Mating starting with a different sire** – this means the dam has been exposed to more than one sire within 14 days of the estimated conception date. In order to resolve the RFI the calf in question requires a parentage test to be completed. (Gestation Length is 282 days in bovine).
2. **Mating clash** – means that you have tried to record more than one calf to said dam. In order to resolve the RFI you will need to clarify how many calves that cow had and which animal is the correct calf.
3. **Sire is not DNA or SNP tested** – the sire needs to have a parentage test set up. All sires that will have registered progeny to them need to have DNA markers on file and need to be at minimum sire verified.
4. **Does not have access to dam** – this means that you do not have access to the dam you are registering the calf to. Please confirm that the dam is correct. If it is, this means that you will need to have the dam either transferred or leased into your name prior to the date of birth of the calf.
5. **Does not have access to sire** – this means that you do not have access to the sire you are registering the calf to. Please confirm that the sire is correct and AI, Natural, or ET calf is selected correctly. If you do not own the sire, you will be required to have sire authorization provided from the owner before we will register the calf, or the sire may need to be AI approved if it is an AI sire.

### TIP 2

When using AI approved sires, please provide a registration number or tattoo on your herd inventory for that bull. The number on the semen tubes will not work as we have no way to cross reference that with our system.

### TIP 3

There are three different numbers that your animals can have:

1. Registration Number
  - a. This is a seven digit number. It means the animal is fully registered.
  - b. Example: RED XXX PRETTY LADY 123F (XXX 123F) **3214567**
2. Pending ID Number
  - a. This is a six digit number beginning with a question mark. It means the animal has been requested to be registered but there is a Request for Information (RFI) on this animal due to an Error(s) or a Warning(s). We need to rectify the RFI information in order to finish the registration. The CAA holds the pricing of registration for these animals for 90 days based on the age they are at recording; after these 90 days the price of registration goes up to the price it is based on the age of the animal when we receive the information to rectify the RFI.

- b. These animals appear on your RFI Summary lists (run bi-monthly) until they either have a registration number or a CM number.
- c. Example: RED XXX HANDSOM LAD 456F (XXX 456F) **?987654**

### 3. Unregistered and/or Commercial Number

- a. This is a six digit number beginning with “CM.” It means the animal has been selected to not be registered by the member. This could be because it is a Steer, there is a commercial/unregistered parent, the member doesn’t wish to register it, an unknown parent, etc.
- b. Example: XXX MR EAT BEEF 789F (XXX 789F) **CM456789**

#### **TIP 4**

##### **Fate Code 12 vs. 15**

###### **Code 12 – Open, missed calving opportunity**

This means that your dam was not pregnant and missed their calving opportunity. If you put this code, your dam will stay within the same calving season as it was previously. For example, if your dam didn’t calve in Spring 2018 but will calve in Spring 2019 you would use this code.

###### **Code 15 – Moved to next calving season**

This means that your dam is pregnant but will not be calving in the current calving season but will calve in the next calving season. For example, if your dam is indicated as being a Spring 2018 calving animal but is calving late you would use this code to make her a Fall 2018 calving animal.

If you use Code 15 when you meant to use Code 12 it will mean that that dam will be moved from one calving season to the next (i.e. Spring to Fall). For example, if your dam XXX 123 is a Spring animal and appeared on your Spring 2018 Herd Inventory and Registration Forms and you put Code 15 she will now appear on your Fall 2018 Herd Inventory and Registration Forms and will not be on your Spring 2019 Herd Inventory and Registration Forms. If you want your animal to go from Spring 2018 to Spring 2019 use Code 12; if you want your animal to move calving seasons from Spring 2018 to Fall 2018 use Code 15.

#### **TIP 5**

When searching for animals, members, and other information in the Online Herdbook you can utilize the “%” sign in your search, especially if you only know part of the information. This indicates for the search to look for items that include the information provided. For example, if you know the animal’s name is PURE 10 but you don’t know the rest of the name, you can search the name “%PURE %10” and any animals that meet the criteria will be shown (in this instance 33 animals). You can do this for tattoos (e.g. “XXX %F”), names, herd letters, towns, etc. in both the Animal Inquiry and Member Inquiry tabs; any animals or members meeting that criteria will be shown.

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### **Bridging the Gap Trucking Bursary**



## Canadian Junior Angus

### **\$14,000 in Scholarships and Prizes Awarded as Canadian Angus Youth Gather in Moose Jaw**

More than 60 Canadian Angus youth and four American Angus youth gathered in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan over the weekend for the fourteenth annual Guiding Outstanding Angus Leaders (GOAL) Conference. \$11,000 was awarded to the five finalists in the Canadian Angus Foundation Legacy Scholarship program and a \$3,000 heifer voucher prize was awarded to one lucky attendee.

Matthew McGillivray of Kamloops, BC placed first and received a \$5,000 scholarship. McGillivray is a second-year student at the University of Alberta in Edmonton working toward a degree in animal science. He intends to further pursue a doctor of veterinary medicine degree and also plans to take over the family ranch. He is the fifth generation to work that land.

Jarrett Hargrave of Proton Station, Ontario placed second and received a \$3,000 scholarship. Hargrave is a second-year student enrolled in animal science technology at Lakeland College in Vermilion, Alberta where he is also the student general manager of the Purebred Student Managed Farm. Hargrave plans to return to Lakeland next year to obtain an agribusiness diploma and then pursue a career in agriculture sales while proceeding to take over the family farm.

Placing third and receiving a \$2,000 scholarship is Naomi Best of Harding, Manitoba. Best is a second-year student at the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon working toward a degree in animal science. She plans to work in the agribusiness sector and continue to build her Angus herd, eventually taking over the family farm, which has been in her family for three generations.

Charlene Elliott of Kenilworth, Ontario and Tyra Fox of Lloydminster, Saskatchewan each received \$500 as runner ups in the competition. Elliott is a second-year student at the University of Guelph, working toward a degree in animal science. She plans to pursue a career as a beef nutritionist and stay involved in her family farm. Fox is a second-year student at Lakeland College in Lloydminster working on the pre-veterinarian program. She plans to pursue a doctor of veterinary medicine degree, specializing in embryology.

The Legacy Scholarship program awards \$11,000 in prizes to Canadian Junior Angus members recognizing overall academic achievement, leadership and community involvement, and industry knowledge. The top five applicants attend the GOAL conference for an interview and panel discussion and the scholarships are awarded during the conference.

In addition to the scholarships, Jasmine Broeder of Assiniboia, Saskatchewan won a \$3,000 heifer voucher. All attendees had their names entered into a draw and her name was selected. Broeder will use the funds toward the purchase of an Angus female in 2019.

CJA members participated in many events as well as workshops throughout the weekend. Highlights from the event included motivational speakers Chad Owens, past NFL/CFL Player and Bruce Vincent, a third-generation logger from Libby, Montana; a presentation on livestock water quality from Colby Elford and Leah Clark of Saskatchewan Agriculture which was followed by water sample testing; a presentation on beef cattle nutrition by Breanna Anderson of Blairs Family of Companies; and participants also completed a Verified Beef Production Plus workshop and were able to tour the Tunnels of Moose Jaw.

The GOAL Conference promotes leadership skills within the Angus breed. Junior members from all over the country attend this three-day event held in a different Canadian location each year. During the event, Juniors hear from nationally recognized speakers, participate in workshops designed to improve their leadership skills, get involved in teamwork activities, and develop beef and industry knowledge. Participants are also given the opportunity to network and socialize with fellow Junior Angus members.

Canadian Junior Angus is a group of Angus enthusiasts under the age of 21. GOAL is an annual networking and interactive function organized by the Canadian Junior Angus board. It rotates throughout the country every February.
